Reflecting On Sunday's Readings

Jeremiah, in this week's Scripture, came bringing a message from God to the people of Israel and consequently was thrown into the mud of a well and left to die. Jesus came bringing a message of hope from the Father and he was beaten, abused, and nailed to a cross to die. What is it about God's communications to humanity that causes people to react so violently? G.K. Chesterton provides significant insight into humankind's longstanding attack on these messengers and messages from God, particularly as it came through Christ. "Suppose we heard an unknown man spoken of by many men. Suppose we were puzzled to hear that some men said he was too tall and some too short; some objected to his fatness, some lamented his leanness; some thought him too dark, and some too fair. One explanation (as has been already admitted) would be that he might be an odd shape. But there is another explanation. He might be the right shape. Outrageously tall men might feel him to be short. Very short men might feel him to be tall. Old bucks who are growing stout might consider him insufficiently filled out; old beaux who were growing thin might feel that he expanded beyond the narrow lines of elegance. Perhaps Swedes (who have pale hair like tow) called him a dark man, while negroes considered him distinctly blonde. Perhaps (in short) this extraordinary thing is really the ordinary thing; at least the normal thing, the centre. Perhaps, after all, it is Christianity that is sane and all its critics that are madin various ways," (from Orthodoxy). Men are willing to accept any religion, religious idea, or supposed message from God as long as it does not infringe upon their freedom to do and think whatever they please. Jesus, however, came to bring an exclusive message from the Father, one that was definitive and authoritative. Because it was definitive it did not leave room for people to form God into their own image, but rather demanded that they discover their true image mirrored

back to them from God's Word and revelation. Because the message was authoritative (having come from the Authority) it left no wiggle room either for deviation from it, or disobedience to it. It is THE true message from the Father, though many may criticize it. I believe this is what Jesus was referring to when he said "Do you think that I have come to give peace on earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." Jesus' sacrifice on the cross and resurrection from the dead draws a dividing line in the sand for all of eternity. On one side of the line are all those who choose to believe Jesus and the message from the Father and to love and follow him. On the other side of the line are all those who choose not to believe and who in rebellion reject him as their Lord. Those are the only two choices open to mankind. Some, when they are confronted with these choices, lash out in anger and rebellion. Like the people in Chesterton's illustration, they justify doing so by accusing the Father and the Son of being "too something...," because the Father and the Son will not conform their message and their persons, to the image created by man's preferences and inclinations. And so the dividing line is drawn. When we consider Jesus and the great cloud of witnesses who have found him faithful and true we can do no other than to stride across the line in the sand of eternity, to stand with him as faithful followers—even if, like Jeremiah, we incur the wrath of those who would kill the messenger because they do not like the message.

Proposed Renovations to the Church

Thank you for your input on proposed renovations. I am pleased by the strong support you have shown to take care of this beautiful house of the Lord.

Incorporating the feedback we've received, here is the work we plan on doing. I'll have the final draft with a presentation for our parish bazaar on the 27th.

TWO Phases:

1st-Necessary, cost-saving, and noticeable Tuck-pointing, shingles, and insulation (~\$55,000) Wiring and paint (\$230,000)

2nd-Repaint the altar and baptismal font, HVAC, flooring, front steps, a new sign, and the bell (\$100,000)

Total estimated capital needs: \$385,000.

NOTES: more attractive lighting solutions did not receive much support, so we will simply aim to do new wiring that can handle brighter light bulbs within the existing fixtures.

In talking with the archdiocese, simply repairing paint never looks good, as the new paint won't have the same layers of candle/incense smoke stains, and you would still have old paint on most of the ceiling. We could clean the rest of the paint, but by the time we do that, we'd be close to a new paint job.
